“Cankers, Chancres and Cancers: A Cornucopia of Clinical Oral Medicine Cases”



Dr. Ross Kerr received his DDS from McGill University in Montreal, Canada, and his MSD and certificate in Oral Medicine at the University of Washington. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral Medicine and Clinical Professor in the Department of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology, Radiology & Medicine at NY University College of Dentistry where he is the director of the Oral Mucosal Disease Service and an attending at the NYU Oral Cancer Center. He is the immediate past president of the American Academy of Oral Medicine and a steering committee member of the World Workshop on Oral Medicine. He is the chair of the Global Oral Cancer Forum, and he serves as a member of the Scientific Advisory Board for the Oral Cancer Foundation. He has lectured nationally and internationally on oral cancer, dry mouth, and other oral medicine related topics, and has contributed to the dental and medical literature.

Attendees will learn, through a series of clinical cases, how to diagnose and manage patients with a variety of oral mucosal diseases and disorders, ranging from common oral lesions, oral infections (including oral sexually transmitted diseases), oral cancer/potentially malignant oral disorders, dry mouth/xerostomia, and other topics of interest to oral healthcare providers.

NJDA Trustee's Report—Dr. Peter DeSciscio

There was a meeting held on 8/16/17. A presentation by Dr. Kathleen O'Loughlin, ADA, Executive Director and Mr. Craig Busey, ADA, General Counsel was made relative to governance and leadership development. The ADA contracted a consultant on this subject and the findings and recommendations are currently being reviewed by the ADA Board of Trustees. Mr. Meisel has filed a lawsuit against Aetna on behalf of five member dentists whom Aetna is seeking to recover overpayments.

An offer was made to Mr. James Garnett for the position of Membership Director of NJDA. He has accepted and should be starting soon.

Treasurers Report: Based on the 2018 estimated deficit, a dues increase of \$25.00 will be recommended.

Accountants Michael Holk and Diane Van Embden reported that their firm conducted an audit of the NJDA accounting practices and found no major adjustments. They reported that our budget process is the best they have ever seen and could serve as a model for other groups.

Full Day Course Synopses

(You must register for the full day; there is no separate registration for just the AM or PM sessions).

AM Session – What we know, what we think we know, and what we don't know about Immediate Extraction Socket Management.

Course Outline:

Immediate placements of implants into extraction sockets is an exciting treatment alternative for our patients. However, there are many potential short and particularly long term risks which the practitioner must be fully aware of. This presentation will focus on the potential problems and benefits both clinically and biologically when the choice of immediate socket placement is made for single and multiple sites.

Upon completion of this presentation participants should be able to:

- Identify what type of healing takes place against the implant in immediate socket placement
- Know how to minimize recession with immediate provisionalization
- Know the proper crown contour for immediate provisionals
- Know if the gap distance really matters
- Know if primary closure should be attempted or should it be left open?
- Know if membranes should be utilized?
- Know what type of graft material if any should be utilized?
- Identify what are the potential short and long term risks involved with immediate placement of implants?

PM Session – Interdisciplinary Approach for Treating the Esthetically Compromised Patient.

Course Outline:

The treatment planning of complex cases requires the highest level of knowledge and skill of the treating team.

It is an orchestration of procedures including proper sequencing and timing that makes the difference.

An envisionment of the final case before starting is required to know where the goal of treatment will be directed. This, in conjunction with the patients needs and clinical situation comprise the decision-making process for what is the best treatment for the patient.

Problems facing the team such as:

- Which teeth to save or extract?
- Should implants be placed immediately or in a delayed protocol?
- Should multiple implants be placed in the aesthetic zone?
- When and how to include orthodontics if needed for sight development
- Should pink ceramic be used or should ridge augmentation be performed?
- Should the case be splinted or broken up into separate bridges or individual teeth?
- How to provisionalize the case throughout treatment
- When to immediate load cases versus do a serial extraction case

These concerns will be addressed in this interdisciplinary approach to our most challenging cases.



It's That Time – Review Your Continuing Education Credits Before October 31 **Joan Monaco, DMD, NJDA Director of Dental Benefits**

The biennial license renewal period for dentistry begins on November 1 of odd-numbered years and ends on October 31, two years later. The current period is November 1, 2015 through October 31, 2017.

According to the NJ State Board of Dentistry regulations, continuing education is a mandatory requirement for license renewal. "All licensed dentists holding active licenses shall submit a certification verifying completion of 40 hours of continuing education every two years at the time of registration renewal..."

There are exceptions to this regulation:

- If you were initially licensed during the 2nd year of a biennial renewal period (in this case, November 1, 2016 – October 31, 2017) you need to verify 20 credits.
- A graduate of dental school who is licensed during the 1st year of the biennial period also needs 20 CEUs.
- Those graduates licensed in the 2nd year of the period are exempt from the continuing education requirement for that biennial period.
- A one-year dental residency or "an approved advanced education program leading to specialty certification" in one of the nine recognized dental specialties satisfy the 40 CEU requirement.

For everyone else, there are maximum numbers of hours allowed for certain topics and for the way in which the material is presented:

- **CPR** – Maximum of 5 hours.
- **Advanced Cardiac Life Support** – Maximum of 15 hours.
- **Written or electronic distance learning** – Maximum of 20 hours – Must include a post-test and verification of completion.
- **Practice Management** – Maximum of 7 hours. **Note: Credit is not given for subjects such as estate planning, financial/tax planning and personal health.**
- **Original papers** – Maximum of 20 hours. A maximum of 10 hours for each original scientific paper. These hours may be divided, at the State Board's discretion, among co-authors.
- **Presentation of a paper, essay or lecture** - 2 hours of CE credit for every one hour of presentation.
- **At this time**, the new law regarding continuing education for opiate prescribing is not in force. The NJDA will keep members apprised when notice is given by the State Board.

These are some of the typical questions asked about earning continuing education. However, the NJ State Board of Dentistry also has CE regulations regarding **teaching and faculty positions**, presentation of **table clinics and scientific exhibits, parenteral conscious sedation**, and **general anesthesia**. Additionally, the Board may, at its discretion, waive all or some of the requirement with cause, such as disability or hardship.

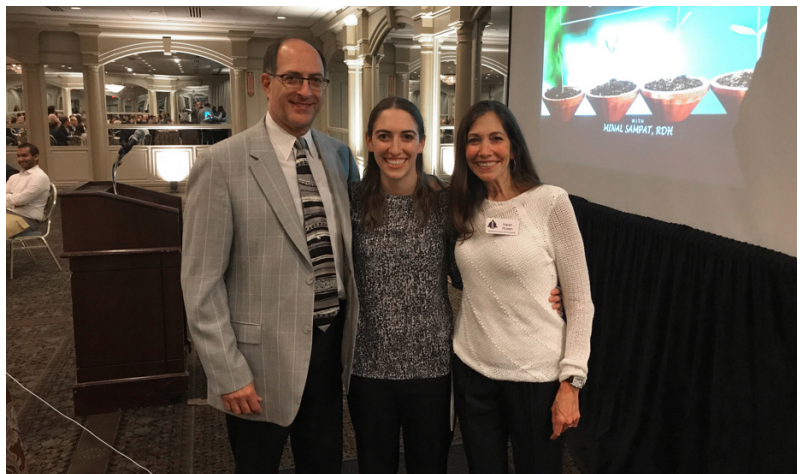


